
ENRICHED AFRICAN-AMERICAN LITERATURE II SUMMER READING 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR

ASSIGNMENT #2

Kanye West recently made a statement that slavery was a choice. You will be writing an argumentative research paper over what Kanye said, "Was slavery a choice?"

You will need to use three pieces of evidence from Kindred in your essay. Additionally, you will need to find two internet sources that support your claim. The internet sources that you use, <u>must</u> come from a site that ends in .org, .net, or .edu. You may also use INFOhio, which can be accessed through the student portal. You must be signed into your school account to access INFOhio. Your essay must include two pieces of evidence from each internet source. In all, that is two pieces of evidence from your first internet source, two pieces of evidence from your second internet source, and three pieces of evidence from your book--a total of seven pieces of evidence.

Your essay should be at least 750 words and at least five paragraphs, but can have more paragraphs and be longer than 750 words. Please keep in mind that the first paragraph is your introduction, and the last paragraph is your conclusion.

Your introduction and conclusion paragraphs should be 6-8 sentences, and your body paragraphs should be at least 10 sentences.

Please include a Works Cited page that lists your sources in proper MLA format. Include Kindred as one of your sources. If you are not sure how to cite your sources, please go to the Purdue Owl which can be accessed through the student portal. You can also get to the Purdue Owl by searching Google.

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR PAPER IS IN MLA FORMAT AND IS DOUBLE SPACED. USE TIMES NEW ROMAN OR ARIAL AS YOUR FONT. THE SIZE OF YOUR FONT SHOULD BE 12.

Be ready to present your essay on the first day of school. 50 points.

Share your essay with me by the first day of school. 200 points.
