NEWS FROM THE NURSE

As the new school year begins, remember these tips to help keep our French Run community well:

- *Send only healthy, well-rested children to school.
- *Keep ill children home until they have been fever, vomit, and diarrhea free for 24 hours without the aid of medication.
- ***The most important defense against germs is good, frequent hand washing!***

SCREENINGS:

All kindergarten, 1st grade, 3rd grade and students new to the district are screened for hearing and vision. If you receive a referral for further follow-up care by a professional, please schedule an appointment right away. If you need assistance in getting care, please contact me at French Run. Good hearing and vision are vital to learning!

MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL:

If your student needs medication to be administered at school, please be aware that there are specific procedures that must be followed. All prescription medications require a form to be completed by the physician and the parent (attached). Medications must be in the original labeled container and must be delivered to the school along with the proper form by an adult. We cannot administer expired medications.

Assessments and Testing

During the school year each child will be assessed on multiple occasions with multiple measures. The purposes of the assessments are to determine where a child begins, to ensure the child is progressing, and to find out how much he or she learned over the course of the year.

This year the local or school-based assessments that we will use for Kindergarten through Fourth Grade are DIBELS(K-3) to measure fluency, STAR Reading, STAR Math, iReady Reading and iReady Math. It is extremely important that students do their best on these assessments, and also understand that they will get some questions wrong. At the beginning of the year we will use these results to form station and rotational groupings in the classroom, as well as intervention groups.

State Mandated Assessments for 3rd and 4th Grade include Reading, Math, and Social Studies (4th only). The state assessments are used to determine achievement scores and grades on school report cards.

If you have any questions about how these tests affect your child, please feel free to contact his or her teacher. All teachers at French Run Elementary are well versed in discussing assessment data. I also love to have these discussions and my office is always open.

Our job of educators is to assist families, and advocate for the best education possible for each one of your children. Whether you know a lot, or a little, we are always here to help. Use us as a resource. The best educational outcomes occur when parent and school relationships remain strong and unified.



School Report Card

As many of you know, the State of Ohio has released school report cards from last year. Many school districts and school buildings received results that were lower than previous school years. Although French Run did not have an impressive grade in the category of Achievement, we fared well in Growth and K-3 Literacy.

Our Continuous Improvement Plan for 2016-2017 addresses our deficits in achievement and we expect to maintain our grades in literacy and growth. If you are interested in speaking about the report card, or our plan to increase achievement outcomes for all students, please come in and speak with me.
