• Create a summer bridge program for incoming 9th Graders who are "not prepared" for high school as identified by our *Pathways for Success* metrics (*also in development*)





- Programming from the outset of a student's experience must align from Kindergarten to 12th Grade
- We can use different modalities and innovative instruction to reach all students
- Vertical discussion is essential
 - (elementary middle high)



Revisiting Daily Schedules

- Can we increase opportunities for teachers to use additional flexibility and creativity in the school day?
