- Ensure our hard-working teachers and support staff are appropriately compensated in an evergrowing and competitive market.
- Continue to provide educational materials and curriculum that promote our Portrait of a Graduate competencies.
- Maintain upkeep on our current buildings and ensure safe and conducive learning spaces for ALL of our students.
- Allow for the continuation of sports, clubs, and extracurricular activities.
- Allow for the continuation of current safety and security measures with existing personnel.
- Maintain our current technology plan for students and staff, ensuring 1:1 access.
- Maintain the district bus replacement schedule to ensure that buses are replaced and maintained in a way that prevents significant future investment.
- Provide ongoing access to mental and behavioral health professionals, such as social workers and counselors.

WHAT IF IT FAILS?

There are many unavoidable expenses related to education, such as special education, transportation, preschool, utilities, etc. Other expenses are "avoidable" in that they are not required by law. If the District needs to take further action to balance the budget, avoidable expenses will need to be reduced.

Examples of "avoidable" expenses:

- Facility management who clean our buildings and maintain our grounds (ABM Industries)
- College textbooks for dual enrollment students
- Elective class offerings such as Mandarin, ASL and programs like Project Lead the Way
- Nurses



- RCS is working with various partners to bring students enriching experiences that will enhance their lives. Giving students the opportunity to earn industry credentials and participate in paid internships will set them apart from others in the industry of their choice.
- K-12 Pathway Articulation: exposing children to our high school pathways beginning at the elementary level so they are prepared to select a pathway upon entering high school. At the elementary level, children will have awareness, inquiry and curiosity experiences with our pathways. At the middle school level, students will explore and discover with a purpose. By the time they reach high school, they will be fully immersed in the pathway.

Prepared Students

Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP), a federal program to promote college aspiration and success, is available to students at both RHS campuses. Staff members from I Know I Can, a Central Ohio college access organization, work with grades 7-12 building aspirations for college and helping seniors with college application milestones including assistance with applications, federal financial aid and scholarships. A Campus Success Coach follows up with students during their freshman year of college to help students deal with that pivotal transition. In addition, all Reynoldsburg grads are eligible for a scholarship for participation in GEAR UP activities.







