Three Pathways

At the end of their freshmen year, students will choose one of three pathways. The pathway that a student chooses will determine the coursework that they take.



Business

This program coordinates with Columbus State Community College or Harrison College, offering relevant skills needed to prepare for business and entrepreneurial careers.



Law

This pathway provides students interested in legal and ethical issues a foundation for understanding critical problem solving methods involved in criminal investigations, as well as exposure to other criminal justice related careers.



Education

This pathway offers the ability to explore education as a career. Content includes teaching methods and strategies, organization and designing of effective lessons and classrooms, as well as child development.
